- Please note that the presentation event is after school. Starts from 3.30 with the presentation as soon as the last runner is back home. I will contact the shop to ask them to be ready to receive lots of requests (note the shop closes at 1630 hrs) for ice creams after you have had your runs so please bring sufficient money.
- There will be 6 courses next week; Boys Years 1-4, Girls Years 1-4, Boys Years 5/6, Girls Years 5/6, Boys Years 7-9, Girls Years 7-9. So you will be running against people of your age in each class.

## Helpful hints for next week

- Don't forget Folding and thumbing of your maps and setting the map in the direction of each control.
- Memorise control codes and control descriptions at the start of each leg
- Plan your route from control to control 'ticking off' features as you go. For example there may be a path junction on this leg, run to it and as you approach the control slow down and take care not to over run.
